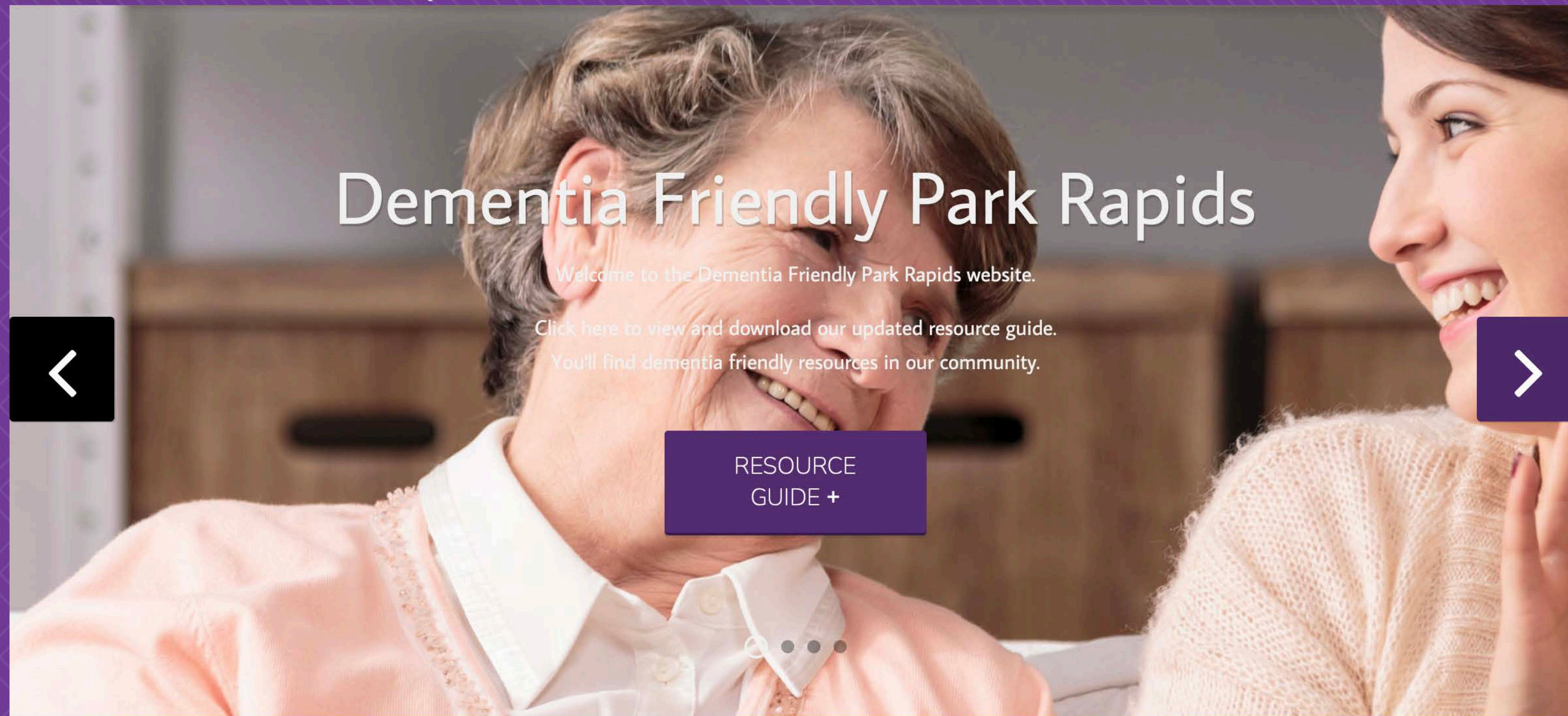

Goal	Activity	Target Audience	Outputs	Outcomes	Method
Engage with local law enforcement agencies to identify opportunities for collaboration.	Offer virtual dementia education webinar with PAC specific to law enforcement.	Local Law Enforcement officers.	25 local law enforcement officers will participate in virtual training.	Local law enforcement officers will self-identify an increase in dementia awareness and knowledge and a comfort in interacting with an individual living with dementia.	Survey Monkey before and after training using NADRC Brief Tool for Dementia-Friendly Education & Training for Sector Trainings

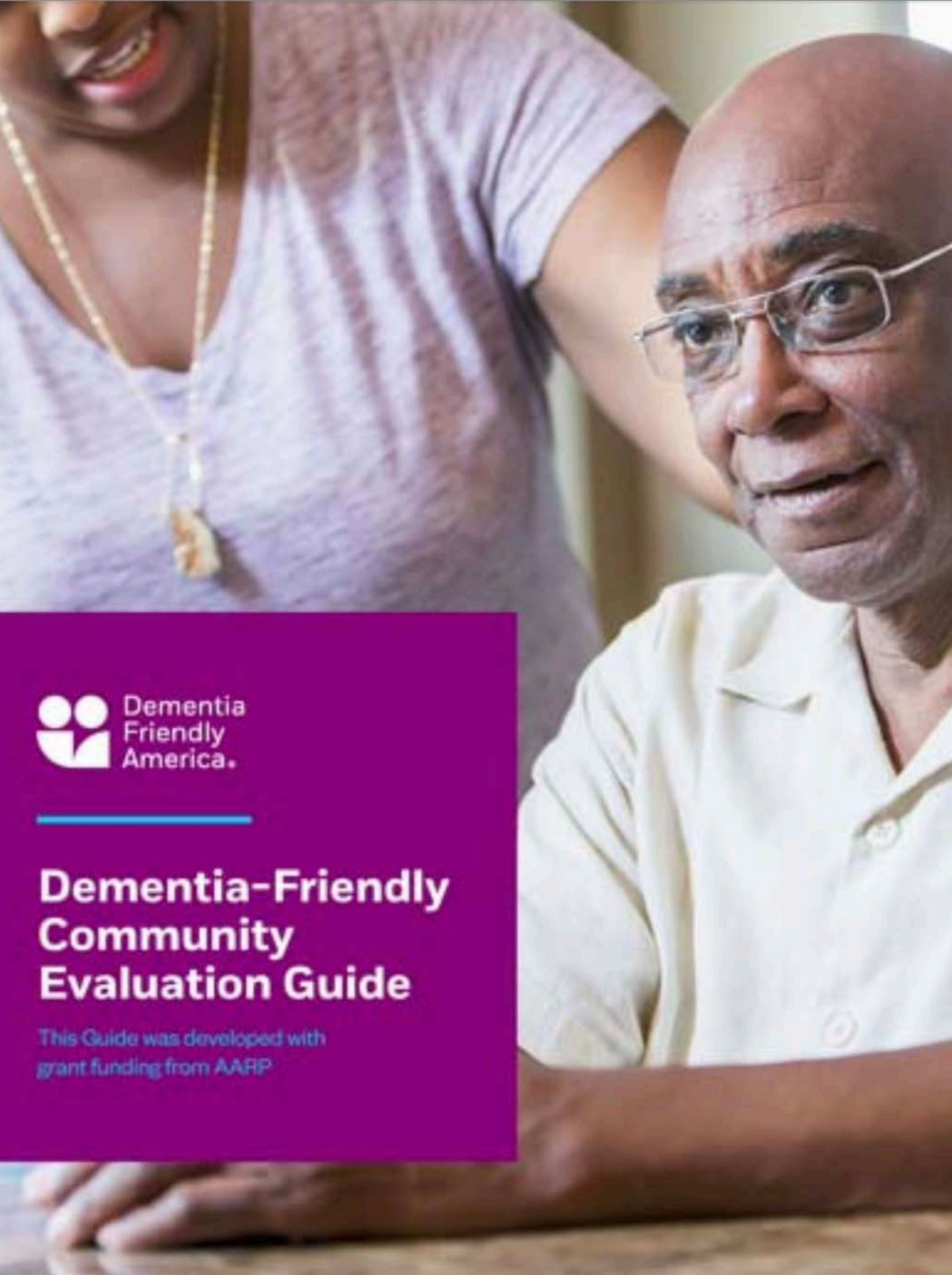
